WELCOME 2015 EXECUTIVE OFFICERS



President John Broderick received his B.S. in Metallurgical Engineering from the University of Arizona and has over 40 years of experience in the mining industry with both Phelps Dodge and Freeport McMoRan Inc. Broderick worked as a metallurgist in smelters at Hidalgo, NM, Ajo and Morenci AZ. At Morenci, he was on the team that constructed and commissioned the first SXEW plants and as hydrometallurgical manager oversaw three additional expansions of the facilities. Broderick has held the site leadership role at Tyrone NM, Bagdad AZ, the Candelaria mine in northern Chile, and the Cerro Verde operation in Peru. He is currently the Vice President and General Manager of the Sierrita mine in Green Valley AZ.

Inductees from Mining's Past: Leonard (1847-1902) & Adolph (1849-1938) Lewisohn

Mining magnate brothers were pioneer developers and philanthropists. Their firm, Lewisohn Brothers, was among the first to invest in copper mines and later became known as "copper kings." The brothers contributed to almost every philanthropic institution in New

York ,regardless of creed.

James Furman Kemp (1859-1926)

Beloved Geology professor, known to all students as "Uncle Jimmie" at Columbia University. Authored <u>Ore Deposits of the United States and Canada</u> in 1893, <u>Handbook of Rocks</u> in 1895 and was a cofounder of *Economic Geology*.

Roscoe Channing (1868-1961)

Selected for the first College All American Football Team while at Princeton; joined Teddy Roosevelt's Rough Riders during the Spanish American War. Established Hudson Bay Mining and Smelting Company with Cornelius Vanderbilt Whitney.

Alberto Benavides (1920-2014)

Founding President of Cia de Minas Buenaventura, Peru's largest locally owned precious metals producer. Spearheaded the construction of one of the world's largest gold mines; founded the mining faculty of the Universidad Catolica de Peru and led a drive to list Peruvian companies on the NYSE.

MFSW Outreach Coordinator Activities: January 2015-April 2015

To date this school year (2014-15) I have been in classes for 80 days, teaching 335 classes to over 9000 students and 87 teachers. There is still about a month left in the school year and my schedule is busy, between school visits and Mining in Society merit badge workshops there is not much office time. According to my estimates, I should be over 10,000 students in classroom settings this year. The table below lists the locations and numbers since the last report in early January.

My presentation (Educating Arizona about Mining: The Evolution of an Outreach Program) at the Minerals Education Coalition technical session during the annual meeting of the Society for Mining, Metallurgy and Exploration was very well received. I have received requests to present at other locations including a teacher workshop in West Virginia. That location is not really feasible but the two teacher workshops organized by the Nevada Mining Association are perfect. I presented and participated in technical sessions at the Las Vegas event in April with 120 teachers present. I am also scheduled to make another presentation during the workshop in Reno this coming July.

Take a look at the http://www.engineergirl.org/ website (run by the National Academy of Engineering) and you will notice the absence of mining and metallurgical engineering. I contacted them and they are now working on adding an Earth Resources Engineer to their site. They are looking for assistance in providing information about mining, metallurgy and petroleum engineering for this site: what do these engineers do,

where do they work, what are the education requirements, lifestyles, skills, salaries, etc. I have put in a request to numerous engineers and am hoping to provide the developers with accurate information. If you can assist me on this, it would be wonderful. They also will need some female engineers to post a profile and be willing to answer questions that come through the website: any ideas?

The IMR is partnering with Eastern AZ College on the GEAR UP program which is starting this fall. The program will track 1392 students scheduled to graduate in 2020. It will provide support through intervention services and enhanced educational opportunities. The students are from nine different school districts in eastern Arizona and the program is predominately funded by a grant from the U.S. Dept. of Education. This program should provide me with an avenue into additional schools previously not served by my program.

Discussions with Froydis Cameron of Anglo-American Exploration centering on how they can assist me in my program are encouraging. I have suggested the best way to help me is to join the MFSW and to sponsor events at the banquet. I will have the opportunity to meet with Froydis when she is in the Tucson area in late September. I have also been in contact with Becky Sawyer of Excelsior Mining regarding outreach programs and materials they are developing.

Thirteen scouts from an Orange County, CA. Boy Scout troop were able to complete their Mining in Society merit badge last week in Tucson. They spent the morning with me in the mining engineering department learning about minerals and rocks mined in Arizona. Mary Poulton talked with them about careers in mining. Dave Streeter introduced them to the rock lab and Moe Momayez taught them about mine ventilation and they also learned the use of LIDAR in mining. They then toured the Pima Mine through the Mineral Discovery Center that afternoon. On Saturday morning we met at the SX mine, they learned about safety and were provided with an underground tour. (See the photo below.)

Partnering with Freeport-McMoRan on Mining in Society merit badge workshops continues. I am leading a workshop in Morenci the last week of April and one at the Sierrita mine the first Saturday of May. As of right now there are approximately 53 scouts registered to participate between the two workshops.

In March I attended the Girl Power luncheon at Amphitheater Middle School. I was able to meet with and discuss mining engineering/geology as a career with over 30 young ladies. The program is organized and implemented by the MESA and robotics teacher at Amphi.

Charles P. Miller 8/19/1929 -2/10/2015

Charles Parker Miller was a revered MFSW Board Member and played a leadership role guiding the Hall of Fame committee for many years. He earned his undergraduate degree from Lehigh University and his M.S. and Ph.D. degrees from Stanford University. Miller started his professional career with Phlelps Dodge, worked for American Metal Climax before founding Miller Resources, Inc. Even in retirement, Miller was active in the mining community and remained a strong advocate to the end. Miller was recently designated as a lifetime member of the Arizona Geological Society for his 50 years of membership and service. His funeral mass was held at St. Odilia's Catholic Church in Tucson, AZ.
